The song ^{is} ~~as~~ started by a soloist who is followed by a chorus. At first it sounds calm, carol-like (?), and then gradually it assumes powerful, imposing (?) sound.

Translation of the words : 'O Quiria,(?) son of the humans, Quiria. Almighty Quiria, O Quiria, Q.... Q... son Quiria, son Quiria, Odia, odia, odia, o. (???).
